STOKE GOLDING NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN

YOUNG PEOPLE SURVEY RESULTS

INDEPENDENT ANALYSIS

June 2017



Overview:

Having produced, circulated and gathered the responses to a survey of young people in Stoke Golding, the Neighbourhood Plan group commissioned the Rural Community Council (RCC) to undertake an independent analysis and interpretation of the results.

About the RCC:

Formed in 1924, the RCC, provide training, advice, and support to Parish Councils and other community organisations including professional consultancy to support the development of Neighbourhood Plans. We have supported over 20 Neighbourhood Plans since 2011 and have been recognised nationally for our innovative approach. We have extensive experience of community consultation and engagement practices and have a strong understanding and hands on experience of the unique issues faced by rural communities.

Response Rate:

From a total of 260 young people in Stoke Golding (Census 2011) a total of 40 completed a survey. This equates to a response rate of 15.4%.

Margin of Error:

Based on the response rate (set out above) and a confidence level of 95% (industry standard) the margin of error for the results of this survey is +/- 14%.

Understanding the Results:


Unless otherwise stated, all whole numbers (e.g. 1) equate to a number (count) of individual respondents.

Unless otherwise stated, all percentages (e.g. 1%) have been calculated as a proportion of the overall number of survey respondents (40).

Free text responses have been grouped into categories (defined by common themes and views) and prioritised based on the total number (count) of comments falling within each category. Comments containing names or direct reference to individuals within the village have been edited or removed.

The RCC's interpretation of what the results to each question represent are highlighted in grey text. These interpretations are based on our independent view of the results and may be used or disregarded in the plan development process as deemed appropriate.

THE RESULTS



Responses have been received from across all age ranges, however most respondents (75%) are aged between 6 and 15 years.

The top 5 things respondents like most about living in Stoke Golding are:


- Countryside / Views (10).

A considerable proportion (62.5%) of respondents would like to continue living in Stoke Golding in the future.


Respondents would like to continue living in Stoke Golding because:


A clear majority of respondents (82.5%) feel safe within Stoke Golding.


Just over half of respondents (52.5%) go to school within Stoke Golding. A significant minority (32.5%) travel to school outside Stoke Golding.

Well over half (60%) of the respondents have indicated that they do not use public transport.


a. If you have ticked Yes, then please tell us where you go to most and how often you go.

Respondents use public transport mainly at weekends and during school holidays.

Around half (52.5%) of the respondents indicated that public transport currently available does meet their needs. Only 4 (10%) of the respondents indicated the contrary.

The 4 respondents that felt the public transport currently available did not meet their needs cited a need for the following:

- More frequent services especially at peak times (2)
- Late service from Hinckley 7 days a week (1)

The facility used by the least respondents is the Methodist Church Hall (70%). Almost half of respondents (47.5%) also never use Baxter Hall or St Margaret's School for out of school activities.

The facilities used by the most respondents are the Village Hall Field (80%), the Village Hall Play Area (70%), and the Village Hall (55%).

14. Please list any leisure activities/pastimes you participate in at the locations and venues detailed above. This could be a club, sporting activity, or hobby, etc.


The main activities / pastimes listed by respondents are:


A clear majority of respondents (70%) would like a Café in Stoke Golding. Over half of respondents would also like Toilets at the Village Hall Field (55%).

- Rugby Posts at the Park (1)


17. Is Mobile Coverage in Stoke Golding...

Marginally more respondents consider mobile coverage to be not acceptable (42.5%) than those what think it is acceptable (32.5%)


18. Is your Broadband speed...

Almost half of respondents (47.5%) consider their broadband speed to be acceptable. Only 25% of respondents consider it to be not acceptable.
